Under the guidelines of the national non-profit, Canstruction™, five local teams will design and construct works of "art" out of canned goods. The theme for this inaugural event on November 15, 2013 is "SEA What We CAN do!"

"This is a win-win for our community," says past-president and board member Deb Reed. "Businesses can form their own morale building teams and/or partner with a service club. They'll work together designing a sculpture on our theme of "The Sea" made of canned goods. Of course, the really fun part is constructing the design within the 10X10X10 space – all within 12 hours!"

The public will be invited to view the "canstructured" works of art on the weekend of November 15th and awards will be presented to participants.

This year PBH is limiting participation to only 5 teams so it's important to apply as soon as possible so as not to be left out!
