On July 27th, Peninsula Behavioral Health proudly celebrated the grand opening of North View, our new 36-unit Permanent Supportive Housing community in downtown Port Angeles.

The Ribbon Cutting & Open House brought together community members, elected officials, donors, project partners, tribal leaders, and supporters to celebrate a milestone years in the making. The event featured a ceremonial blessing by the Lower Elwha Klallam Tribe, remarks from community leaders, and tours of the beautiful new building.

North View provides safe, affordable housing paired with supportive services for adults living with a serious behavioral health need who have experienced homelessness or housing instability. More than just apartments, North View offers residents the opportunity to build stability, improve their health, and thrive in a supportive community.

This project would not have been possible without the dedication of our funding partners, generous donors, elected officials, architects, contractors, consultants, Peninsula Behavioral Health staff, and the many community members who believed in the vision of creating more supportive housing on the Olympic Peninsula.
